How to get here:

- **By plane:** Fly into Indianapolis airport. There are two shuttle services from the airport to Bloomington:
 - The Bloomington Shuttle, \$35 round trip. Drops off at several motels and at the campus Union. Make reservations online or call 1-800-589-6004.
 - <u>Classic Touch Limousine</u>, \$66 round trip. You request the drop-off location. Make reservations <u>online</u> or call 1-800-319-0082.
- By car:
 - O The Mathematics Department is located in Rawles Hall on 3rd Street near the intersection with Woodlawn Avenue. The red star on this map indicates this intersection. Parking in the Atwater parking garage (1/2 block south of 3rd Street and Woodlawn) is free on the weekend. If you arrive on Friday, get a ticket and come to math department to ask for 1 day permit.

- O By way of Indianapolis: Take Indiana 37 south. Exit at the first Bloomington offramp: south on North Walnut Street (Business 37). Southbound lanes become College Avenue. Take left onto 3rd Street. Eastbound lanes become Atwater. Take a left *after* the parking garage, and park there.
- O By way of Terre Haute: Take Indiana 46 east to Bloomington. Take right on College Avenue. Take left onto 3rd Street. Eastbound lanes become Atwater. Take a left *after* the parking garage, and park there.
- O By way of Louisville: Take Interstate 65 north to Columbus, Indiana. Take Indiana 46 west. In Bloomington, Indiana 46 becomes 3rd Street. Continue on 3rd Street. Dormitories and other campus buildings will appear on right. Take left on Woodlawn Avenue. Take next two lefts, thus rounding the parking garage. Park there.
