Course topics: Matrices, Gaussian elimination, vector spaces, LU-decomposition, orthogonality, Gram-Schmidt process, determinants, inner products, eigenvalue problems, applications to differential equations and Markov processes.

Grading: The final grade will be determined as follows:

- 100 points (20%) Midterm 2, given in class on Friday, April 7

Attendance: A sign-in sheet will be randomly distributed during the semester. There is no penalty for the first four absences noted, but if a student misses more than 4 classes, 15 points will be deducted from their final grade for each additional lecture missed. Quizzes: Quizzes of length between 10 and 15 minutes will be given every week in class on Fridays, except for weeks of midterm exams. No calculators or outside notes are permitted during quizzes. The lowest 3 quiz scores will be dropped.

Homework: For each lecture a set of problems from the book will be assigned and posted on the course web page. *These will not be collected*. However, the quiz problems will closely resemble problems from the homework.

Make-up Exams: Make-ups for the midterms will be given only in extreme circumstances (e.g. a documented emergency). Make-up exams will be more difficult, to compensate for the fact that a student making up the exam will have had more time to study.

The final exam is scheduled for Tuesday May 2, 3:30-5:30 PM. Students with a legitimate scheduling conflict (e.g. 3 exams scheduled on the same day) must contact the instructor as soon as possible **and before April 1** in order to reschedule.
